

Rivendale Boers kick off the New Year

Rivendale Boer Goat Stud has had a great start to the New Year with the birth of twin females on January 10th.

The new does represent the start of a new genetic line for both Rivendale and Tasmanian Boer goat breeders.

Rivendale imported a number of new bucks from Pacifica Stud in NSW mid last year and have already reaped the rewards of the Boer goat's "aseasonal" breeding qualities!

Two of the 2009 born Pacifica bucks have been running with a number of Rivendale's does since early November so ap-

proximately 40 kids are expected to be born around Easter.

The new genetic lines will bring faster growing kids with improved structural conformation which ultimately equates to more meat per goat in a shorter timeframe.

This is great news for commercial meat producers and even the self-sufficient families who will be able to produce meat at a lower cost.

For those interested in stud breeding and showing, the new genetic line will put Rivendale's progeny at a National competition level.

2011 is expected to be

a bumper year so customers are urged to place their livestock orders early to avoid missing out.

Just a reminder that Rivendale is always buying unwanted goats of any breed for meat processing to keep up with the current local goat meat demand.
